The Connect With Us section describes offerings hosted by our corporate core. These events are designed to enhance students' professional development while fostering valuable connections between industry representatives and students.

#### **Networking Showcase - \$300**

Our 10th annual Networking Showcase will be held on the morning of Oct. 8, 2024 directly before the inperson Cal Poly Fall Career Fair on Oct. 9-10. This showcase is a wonderful opportunity for our SWE members and company representatives to network in a casual setting before the career fair. The inperson event will be held on the Cal Poly campus, and is very popular among our members! Refreshments and light appetizers will be provided for all attendees.

#### Evening With Industry - \$950 EWI Giving Link \*Fair Market Value Price: \$90

We will be hosting our 49th annual in-person Evening with Industry (EWI) on Jan. 28, 2025. This event includes a networking session, sit-down dinner, keynote speaker, scholarships, and much more! This is our largest SWE event of the school year and is a wonderful opportunity for our members to make meaningful connections with company representatives. Last year's EWI included 28 companies and 200+ students. This year, our event will be held in person in San Luis Obispo and will coincide with Cal Poly's annual in-person Winter Career Fair on Jan. 28-29.

Every Wednesday during the academic year, we hold a club-wide meeting open to our 500+ members. At these meetings, we ask for a company sponsor to present to our members on a predetermined meeting topic. SWE Outreach strives to empower future generations of engineers with an emphasis on working with underserved populations in our surrounding community. From elementary schools to colleges, our goal is to let students know that anyone can be an engineer!

Teaches engineering concepts through interactive activities to middle school students from Santa Maria. Last year, we had over 160 participants and 40 volunteers!

This competition brings in 45+ teams of high school students competing for a spot at VEX State Championships. The matches involve technical design, coding, skillful driving, teamwork, and strategy. Our 140+ volunteers make this event possible.

Our bi-monthly robotics program introduces elementary/middle school students to computing topics through in-person hands-on activities. Students solve fun coding and Arduino simulation challenges.

This is a new biannual event for ages 5-13 consisting of themed labs to expose the participants and their supporters to science and engineering concepts that focus on teamwork, creativity, and problem-solving.

During National Engineering Week, we visit 4th grade classrooms to lead a hands-on activity where students think critically and creatively to solve a problem – just like a real engineer! CPSWE volunteers visited 54 classrooms from Santa Maria to Atascadero, reaching over 1580 fourth-grade students in February 2024.

CPSWE members visit our alma-maters and other high school classes and teach them about Cal Poly and engineering. This summer, 10 awesome volunteers brought SWE-EETY to high schools all over California, totaling over 500 students.

High school students are invited to visit our engineering school. This past Spring, we hosted 100 conditionally admitted incoming students for an overnight experience! Participants are paired 1:1 with a female engineering student in their same major.

SWENext sections from high schools across California complete a year-long engineering project and travel to the Cal Poly campus to present their work and attend the Leadership Training Conference.

Incoming Cal Poly transfer students from 7 California community colleges spend the afternoon sharing experiences, advice, and creating connections.

We visit both elementary and middle school classrooms once a month to connect with students who do not currently have access to a strong STEM curriculum. 120 students attend each month!

## Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

The Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion section highlights SWE's efforts to cultivate belonging within engineering. CPSWE's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion core strives to provide an inclusive space for members to express their individuality and authenticity while also building on valuable technical skills.

#### Cultural Collaborations - \$300 per event

Cultural Collaborations allow students to express their authenticity, embrace their intersectionality, and broaden their perspectives. CPSWE hosts three collaborations with different entities on campus per quarter. We uncover different cultural perspectives and societal impacts involving engineering. This past year, we partnered with the Taiwanese Cultural Organization for a Taipei 101 event. Students learned about Taiwanese culture and the different structural components of Taipei 101, a skyscraper in Taiwan.



#### **Build Days & Machine Shop Certifications - \$300**

This is an opportunity to build and reinforce students' technical skills in the Cal Poly machine shops. CPSWE's two-step initiative allows predominantly underrepresented students to build technical skills by becoming red-tag certified at the CP Machine Shops. Red Tag Certification Tours are 3-hour introduction courses to the machines in the shops, students must complete this course to become certified. CPSWE hosts tours multiple times a quarter. This past year, we were able to provide 65 students with red tag certification. To reinforce the skills learned in tours we host Build Day. Build Day is a 6-hour event where students come into the shops and build guided projects from raw materials alongside experienced volunteers.
